- English proficiency level intermediate (all courses are in English).
- Send you application before the deadline (June 15th).

PAYMENT

The price of the program is 1200 US Dollars (for partner universities please ask for promotion), including all educational units. The trips offered are not included in the price and depend on the demand. Moreover, housing and food are neither included.

Payment before arrival

Please make sure that your payment for the course has been transferred before the deadline (prior to June 15th).

Payment after arrival

In order to assure your place, a non-refundable deposit of \$200 USD must be made to the same account showed above prior to June 15th. This money will be taken in consideration and the rest can be paid after your arrival at the university cashier, either in cash or with you credit card.

After transferring the money to the account, you must scan your payment receipt and send it in via email to emreynos@up.edu.mx to confirm your enrollment to the program.

ACCOMODATION

After the payment confirmation, the International Affairs Office takes care of your accommodation, all you have to do is indicate your preferences in the application form. The International Affairs Coordinator will send you the information of the available places according to your request.
